What We Are Learning in December

Math- Wrapping up our Number Sense and Numeration Unit. We will be learning about the following math concepts.

-Arrays

- Multiplication (through arrays, repeated addition, skip counting and adding on)

-Doubles

There will be a number sense unit test before the holidays. A review will be sent home in advance to help your child study.

Reading- Making Connections. Students will be practicing making connections to a text read independently or read aloud to them. They will be working on making Text-to-Self connections (Relating book to something in their life), Text-to-Text (relating text to another text they have read), and Text-to-World (relating text to an event that has happened in the world).

Writing- Procedure Writing. We will be practicing how to write out steps involved in a variety of situations (e.g. putting on a snowsuit, baking a recipe, etc)

Social Studies- Continuing learning life in Canada from 1780-1850. This month we will be working on our inquiry research projects.
